The therapy team on Lime Walk, a specialist Open Rehabilitation, Recovery and Assessment Unit based in Macclesfield for service users with chronic and enduring mental health problems, have started a blog to promote understanding and awareness of mental health, personal responsibility, education, self-advocacy, support and hope for service users, carers and their families.
