Level Up, Cheshire and Merseyside, Young People and Families Provider Collaborative is thrilled to announce that we have been shortlisted for four prestigious national awards at this year's Patient Experience Network Awards (PENNA).

The PENNA awards honour outstanding achievements and best practices in patient experience across the health and social care sectors. Level Up have been recognised for their dedication to transforming patient care pathways, reducing variations in care, and fostering collaboration among stakeholders to provide personcentred care in the mental health sector.

Level Up, Cheshire and Merseyside, Young People and Families Provider Collaborative, is a pioneering partnership between CWP, Alder Hey NHS FT, Cygnet Healthcare, Mersey Care NHS FT, and Priory Health Care. This collaborative is dedicated to improving mental health services for young people and families in Cheshire and Merseyside. By combining the expertise of clinical professionals with the insights of individuals with lived experience, Level Up aims to create a personcentred approach that breaks down barriers and redefines mental health service delivery. The LPCs represent a transformative approach to mental health services, emphasising clinical leadership, user involvement, and crosssector collaboration. Through this initiative, CWP and its partners have reimagined mental health service delivery, breaking down barriers and fostering a culture of co-production.

Level Up, Cheshire and Merseyside, Young People & Families Provider Collaborative held a Transformation event in June at Aintree Racecourse in Liverpool.

Level Up is focused on ensuring that all services across Cheshire and Merseyside providing Tier 4 Children and Adolescent Mental Specialist Health Services are working closely together to provide the best possible outcome to young people who access the services and their carers/families.

Delegates from all over Cheshire and Merseyside heard from a range of speakers including Level Up Expert by Experience Forum members who shared their lived experience of accessing mental health services, highlighting barriers, good practice and directly to commissioners.

NUNG'S EXPERIENCE

Nung is a member of the Level Up Expert by Experience Forum. Nung bravely shares her lived experience journey with us so that we may help other people and inspire change across young people and family's mental health services in Cheshire and Merseyside.

In Nungs words:

My experience began when I was 9 years-old when I first came to the UK. I went through difficulties during my childhood, but also, I wasn't living with my parents, that's quite usual in Asia. Your parents work somewhere else and leave you with family. Looking back this contributed greatly to my struggles and attachment difficulties.

I really struggled to get through each day. I don't think anyone else knew what was going on. My mental health deteriorated when I got bullied for the colour of my skin and my name.

Even though there was support around me such as school, health professionals the bullying continued through other young people and via social media. It was constant. When you see and hear all those negative comments, after a while you unfortunately start believing them yourself.

My mental health took a turn and I began to feel even worse.

Once one bullying case was resolved a different bully would start. It affected me massively. It was a build up, constantly every day.

Another difficulty was just after being reunited with my mum and dad in the UK, my dad sadly passed away unexpectedly. I was trying to deal with bereavement on top of this. It all started the build up inside. Eventually I felt like I was fizzing about to pop. I feel that's how I would describe my mental health at the time.

As I developed and aged I experienced other difficulties. I was at home alone when we were burgled. This heightened by anxiety and caused severe trauma. I think the trauma was suppressed, I didn't want to deal with it and eventually it was just too much and everything came all at once. I was admitted to Ancora House Hospital an inpatient. I felt this was a short-term solution fix at that time. I then went into care where I got discharged to.

My mental health issues built up over a period of time and it only made me feel more vulnerable and weaker for who I am.

Speaking about it now, I'm in a much stronger place. I'm in a completely a different place to where I was two years ago".

I joined Level Up Forum as an expert to help shape Specialised Mental Health Services for young people and families. I have highlighted my experience with a hope that services listen and learn. I don't want anyone to go through the same struggles that I did. Level Up is a strong voice for young people and families across Cheshire and Merseyside.

Listen to young people. We are the experts. We are the future.



MEET THE TEAM

12 MONTHS AS THE GATEWAY PROGRAMME TEAM

In this newsletter's Meet the Team we hear from Elizabeth Collins, Gateway Programme Manager.

This week marked a year since Hannah and I came into post as the Gateway Programme Team and I'm reminded of a Dr Seuss quote:

How did it get so late so soon?

It's night before it's afternoon, December is here before it's June

As for any significant milestone, the passing of time turns thoughts to other numbers and, since August 2022 there have been:

- 9 Gateways at Place implemented across Cheshire and Merseyside
- 126 Gateway Meetings for NHS, Social Care and Education colleagues to consider the needs of 176 young people
- 17 formal information and learning sessions delivered, attended by 199 professionals
- 3 online events for our Community of Practice, with 1 in-person event held in Warrington and 3 webcasts recorded by professionals for professionals

We have had the privilege of working with wonderful Experts by Experience and professionals during this time, who have generously shaped our work with their feedback and ideas for engagement, learning and development.

The programme has also benefitted from some fantastic opportunities, including having been nominated for an NHS Parliamentary Award, selected to deliver a poster presentation at the RCPsych Annual Conference and included in the CWP Big Book of Best Practice.

We are looking forward to continuing to engage with those colleagues during the coming six months on the programme evaluation with Liverpool John Moores University and the opportunities for shared improvement we will generate in partnership. In addition, we are delighted to be generating new collaborations to support professionals working to address complex unmet needs for children and young people in Cheshire and Merseyside.

Thank you very much to all our partners and stakeholders, including Experts by Experience. We are truly grateful for your support.
